First Sunday of Advent

As we begin the season that leads to the joyful celebration of Christ's birth, why does the Church remind us of the destruction caused by the flood?" Noah "found favor with the Lord" (Gn 6:8). God sent a flood to destroy the corruption of the earth and to begin anew. Those who were righteous and prepared – Noah and his family – were spared by taking refuge in the 'ark'. "I will establish my covenant with you." God told Noah (Gn 6:18).

In Advent we are reminded of the grace and mercy that flooded the earth in Jesus Christ. Advent means that "God will save us from our corruption, not simply with a good and blameless man like Noah who walked with God, but with a good and blameless man who is God Himself – Jesus Christ. Advent renews God's sanctifying call to walk with Him." (Fr. Peter John Cameron, O.P.) Because Jesus is the Savior of the human race, tradition calls Mary the "Ark of Salvation." In giving birth to Jesus, she gave Him the precious blood – the blood of the "new and eternal covenant," as we hear at Mass – that washes away our sins. *Lord Jesus, fill my heart with a longing to welcome you. Give me, I pray, the grace to live each day in your grace, ready to be with you for all eternity. Amen.*

Wrap your thoughts around this!

Advent is a season of burgeoning life, a season of tending life, and a season of becoming. This is perhaps the greatest theological thunderclap of Advent: that God, who *IS*, who only is – who has no *was*, who has no *will be* – now, in the Incarnation, is *becoming*. God is doing something that, as God, he could not do: He could not change, He could not grow, He could not become. He simply *IS* essence. He is the "is-ness" that is the heart of being. Now, choosing to become Incarnate, God, as man, can *become*. During the Advent season we commemorate his *becoming* in the womb of a woman.....I love to recall the word of the poet Sister Madeleva that I find ineffably dear: "In Advent I always feel that I should walk on tiptoe." Indeed, in the wonder of Advent, we should spiritually walk on tiptoe, full of expectancy, full of wonder". (*Mother Mary Francis of Our Lady, P.C.C.-abbess of the Poor Clare Monastery of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Roswell, NM*).
