TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Wisdom 9:13-18b

This reading acknowledges that people have had a difficult time attempting to know God's wishes. At times we have difficulty understanding the things that happen on earth. Therefore, learning of things in heaven would have been impossible, except that God sent us wisdom and the Holy Spirit to help us understand him.

Second Reading: Philemon 9-10, 12-17

Paul writes to Philemon regarding Onesimus, a slave who ran away and encountered Paul. Although Paul wished Onesimus could remain with him, he did not want to violate Philemon's wishes. Paul asks that Philemon receives his friend Onesimus as a beloved brother, not as a slave. He closes by saying, "Welcome him as you would me."

Gospel: Luke 14:25-33

Jesus warns people who wish to follow him that they must abandon everyone else first. A person calculates the amount of money needed to complete a project before they begin it. In the same way, Jesus warns these people to consider exactly what is involved before they make a commitment to follow him.

"Great crowds were travelling with Jesus, and he turned and addressed them, 'If anyone comes to me without hating father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple."

What does it take to be a disciple of Christ? A heavy question seeking a serious answer. Our text about hating family seems so distant from the norm, 'love God above all things and my neighbor as myself.' Perhaps the response is to make sure that God comes first in my life and that everything else flow from it.

We have been taught by the late and loved Pope Francis that we are called to be missionary disciples. I love my family; I accept the challenges of the cross that I bear for Him and try to follow the call of Jesus by practicing my faith. That is the first step. To be a missionary I am being sent to bring that faith and discipleship to others. If all Catholics returned to practice the faith and lived the message of Jesus, the beatitudes, what a different world it would be. It begins with me, here and now.



Faith Formation News

Sept 7, 2025 - 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

"The Grace of Discipleship"

"As little infants you must be born

anew till Jesus Christ is formed in you" (cf. Gal 4:19). To have Jesus Christ formed in us is to think as He did, to speak as He spoke, and will as He willed.... This labor must be commenced with sweetness and cheerfulness and persevered in with tranquility and composure of mind, never frightened at the task, but believing that Jesus Christ can and will effect this new birth within us.... He must be recognized in our conduct, meek and humble as He was, and this not only in the exterior, but chiefly in our hearts. Ever complying, ever forbearing, ever charitable, ever compassionate to the weakness and frailties of others....When Jesus Christ calls on us to renounce all for His sake, it is not his intention to leave us friendless or without comfort, but to fill up the vacuum in our hearts with Himself, that is, with delights far surpassing any the world could bestow, and a happiness such as the inhabitants of heaven alone can enjoy....

If we read of extraordinary things, miracles, etc., being performed by some of the saints, God permitted this not as a testimony of their sanctity, but for the conversion of those who were witnesses of them.... There are more saints in heaven that never did anything extraordinary, and who have perhaps attained a far greater degree of glory than those whose lives were remarkable for great actions. It is not the action but the spirit that actuates it to which God looks and according to which He will judge and reward us. (Venerable Catherine McAuley, r.s.m. († 1841) was an Irish religious sister and the foundress of the Sisters of Mercy.)

Filled with the "New Wine" of the Love of Jesus

I have asked but one grace for you—that you may understand the words of Jesus: Love one another as I have loved you. Can you tell me how He loved you? Ask yourself

and then see, do you really love your sisters as He loves you? More and more I understand [that] unless and until this love is among us, we can kill ourselves with work, it

will be only work, but not love. Work without love is slavery. We have so much to thank God for....

We cannot truly love and serve the poor unless we have that love of God in our hearts. We will only have that if we are empty of all selfishness and insincerity. This love must start at home. Ask Jesus to give you His heart to love with. Jesus gave His life to love us and tells us that we also have to give whatever it takes to do good to one another.... Jesus died on the cross because that is what it took for him to do good to us; to save us from our selfishness and sin. He gave up everything to do the Father's will, to show us that we too must be willing to give up everything to do God's ways, to love one another as He loves each one of us. That is why we too must give to each other until it hurts. It is not enough for us to say I love God, but I also have to love my neighbor. (Saint Teresa of Calcutta († 1997) founded the Missionaries of Charity and won the Nobel Peace Prize.)



It is typical in the Church to celebrate a saint's death day instead of the saint's birthday. The birthday of the Blessed Virgin Mary is an exception because in her humanity God "has prepared a living temple

where His Son, made flesh, wanted to live among us and give us salvation"; she "reminds us that God is faithful to His promises" (Pope Francis). In fact, from the first moment of her existence God had a loving plan for her—and through her, for us! In honoring Mary on her birthday we honor God, for "he who established the heavens in wisdom has fashioned a living heaven" (Byzantine liturgy).



We reverence the **Most Holy Name** of Mary because a name bespeaks who a person is. As the Immaculate Mother of God, Mary is, to the depths of her soul, most holy, and she desires us to call upon her. In

the words of Saint Bernard of Clairvaux: "Look to the Star of the Sea, call upon Mary. In danger, in distress, in doubt, think of Mary, call upon Mary. May her name never be far from your lips, or far from your heart. If you follow her, you will not stray; if you pray to her, you will not despair; if you turn your thoughts to her, you will not err. If she holds you, you will not fall; if she protects you, you need not fear; if she is your guide, you will not tire; if she is gracious to you, you will surely reach your destination."
