

DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA

First Reading: Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12

This reading from the Prophet Ezekiel tells of the streaming, healing waters that flow from the temple. These waters restore life to the river's inhabitants as well as the fruit bearing trees along its banks. It is believed that the water signifies blessings, whereas the lack of signifies trouble, hardship.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 3:9c-11, 16-17

Paul compares us to a building whose foundation has been laid by Jesus. As the people of God, we can only be solid if we are grounded in Christ.

Gospel: John 2:13-

Near the time of Passover, Jesus went up to Jerusalem and saw the temple had become a marketplace. He became angry and proceeded to drive out the vendors and livestock. Jesus spoke of destroying the temple and rebuilding it in three days. The Jews did not know Jesus was speaking of his body, but when his resurrection from the dead came to pass, his disciples remembered what Jesus had said and came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken.

THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA

"You are God's building. According to the grace of God given to me, like a wise master builder I laid a foundation, and another is building upon it. But each one must be careful how he builds upon it, for no one can lay a foundation other than the one that is there, namely Jesus Christ...Do you not know that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?"

We move from recalling a major basilica in Rome, and use St. Paul's image, to look at our own Christian lives. Through baptism a foundation was laid, a seed was planted, and growth has taken place. How important to appreciate the apostle telling me I am a dwelling place of God and I ask that I can recognize that others, made in His image and likeness, reveal His presence as well.



Faith Formation News Nov 9, 2025 The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

"You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the nether world shall not prevail

against it." (Mt 16:18) In the year 313 the Roman emperor Constantine published the Edict of Milan, granting religious freedom to Christians. Constantine himself donated the palace of the Lateran, a portion of his wife's dowry, to the Church for its first basilica. The Lateran is the cathedral of the Bishop of Rome, the pope, and, as such, it ranks as the "mother and head of all the churches in the city and the world." From its dedication on this date in 324 until the 15th century, the Lateran was the residence of the popes. Within the interior, towering statues of the twelve apostles bearing the instruments of their martyrdom surround the central nave along the north and south walls.

BLESSINGS IN A CEMETERY

My husband and I had our first date in a cemetery. Back then, we had no idea we would one day raise a family together nearby, or that this old cemetery would become a beloved part of our life together. We only knew we were in a beautiful place, where we walked and talked for hours. When our babies were born, we put them in infant carriers and walked through the same cemetery together. As our children grew older, they watched deer, chased falling leaves, and listened to birdsongs under the shade of majestic old cemetery trees, while I read headstones and prayed for the souls of the faithful departed whose bodies were buried there—souls who began to feel like old friends. Now, more than twenty years since our first date, my husband and I have been looking for a new home. Like most families, we have a checklist of things we hope to find in a house. One thing on that list is a bit unusual, though: We want to live near a cemetery. To us, it is not only a reminder of death; it is a reminder of life. The cemetery connects us to people who lived-people, who also watched deer, chased falling leaves, listened to birdsongs, and prayed. And though these precious moments on earth are fleeting, they are also eternal, for they are a glimpse, a foretaste, a hint of the abundant life that begins where this life ends. PILGRIMS of HOPE The MOTIVE for HOPE

Presence of God - Make me understand well, O Lord, that my



HOPE must be founded on You, on Your infinite merciful love. 1. If we had to base our hope on our own merits and on the amount of grace we possess, it would be very insecure, because we cannot be

certain that we are in the state of grace, nor can we be certain about our good works which are always so full of defects. But our hope is sure because it is founded, not on ourselves, but on God, on His infinite goodness, on His salvific will which desires "all men to be saved" (1 Tim 2,4), and on His sanctifying will that wants us not only to be saved, but also to be saints: "This is the will of God, your sanctification" (1 This 4,3) God wishes the certitude3 of our hope to rest upon Him alone. Although He demands our cooperation and our good works. He does not want us to base our confidence on them; in fact, after having urged us to do all that is in our power, Jesus added: "When you shall have done all these things that are commanded you, say: We are unprofitable servants" (Lk 17,10). Souls who are accustomed to depend on their own strength and who delude themselves, thinking they an enter more deeply into the spiritual life by their own personal resources; find this lesson hard to understand. That is why when the Lord wills them to progress, He makes them go through painful states of powerlessness, permitting them to feel the rebellion and repugnance of nature that they may be convinced of the vanity of placing their confidence in themselves. There is here a delicate point: to know how to accept this experience without falling into discouragement. If in the past, we have relied upon ourselves, and now, in certain difficulties and trials of our interior life, we see our strength reduced to nothing, let us thank God. In this way He is detaching us from the too great confidence we had in ourselves, and is forcing us to practice a purer, more supernatural hope, one stripped of every human element and support. If, however we cannot place our hope in ourselves, this is reason for despair; rather, it should impel us to place our hope in God alone and force us to throw ourselves upon Him with full confidence like a child who takes refuge in its mother's arms with more trust, the weaker and more powerless it feels itself to be. The Jubilee Year of HOPE will end January 6, 2026, the Solemnity of the Epiphany. There is still time to receive the special blessings and indulgences that are available to the faithful. For the next few months, there will be reflections of HOPE in the bulletin.
