First Reading: Isaiah 2:1-5

The words of Isaiah urge all people to forsake war and to live in peace forever. The tone reaches a climax in the words, "One nation shall not raise the sword against another, nor shall they train for war again."

Second Reading: Romans 13:11-14

Paul invites us to put away all the things of darkness and sin and to prepare for the coming of Christ.

Gospel: Matthew 24:37-44

A comparison is made between the destruction caused by the flood in Noah's time and the need to be prepared for the second coming of Christ. "You must be prepared in the same way. The Son of Man is coming at the time you least expect."

Faith Formation News Nov 30, 2025 First Sunday of ADVENT Year A

"So too, you also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the

Son of Man will come. "Waiting for Christ. Each New Year, as it passes, brings us the same warnings again and again, and none perhaps more impressive than those with which it comes to us at this season.... The year is worn out. Spring, summer, autumn, each in turn, have brought their gifts and done their utmost, but they are over, and the end is come.... Thus the soul is cast forward upon the future, and in proportion as its conscience is clear and its perception true does it rejoice solemnly that the night is advanced, the day is at hand, that there are a new heaven and a new earth (Rv 21:1) to come, though the former are failing. Nay, rather, because they are failing, it will soon see the king in his beauty and behold a land that stretches afar (Is 33:17). These are feelings for [those] waiting...calmly though earnestly, for the advent of Christ. And such, too, are the feelings with which we now come before him in prayer day by day. The season is chill and dark, and the breath of the morning is damp, but all this befits those who are by profession penitents and mourners, watchers and pilgrims.... True faith does not covet comforts. It only complains when it is forbidden to kneel, when it reclines upon cushions.... Its only hardship is to be hindered, or to be ridiculed, when it would place itself as a sinner before its judge....One year goes and then another, but the same warnings recur. The frost or rain comes again; the earth is stripped of its brightness; there is nothing to rejoice in. And then, amid this profitableness of earth and sky, the well-known words return: the prophet Isaiah is read, the same epistle and Gospel bidding us to awake from sleep and welcome him who comes in the name of the Lord, the same prayers, beseeching him to prepare us for judgment. O blessed are they who obey these warning voices, and look out for him whom they have not seen, because they have loved his appearing (2 Tm 4:8)....At present, we are in a world of shadows.... Suddenly it will be rent in twain and vanish away, and our Maker will appear. He will look on us, while we look on him. (Saint John Henry Newman († 1890) was a convert to the Catholic faith and a preacher of great eloquence. He was made a cardinal by Pope Leo XIII in 1879. / From Waiting for Christ: Meditations for Advent and Christmas.)

"Almighty, omnipotent Lord, show me my poverty




so that I may confess it. I said that I was rich and that I needed nothing; I did not know that I was poor, blind, naked, wretched, and miserable. I believed that I was something and I was nothing. I said, 'I shall

become wise,' and I became foolish; I thought that I was prudent, but I deceived myself. And I see now that

wisdom is your gift, that without you we can do nothing, for if You, O God, do not keep the city, he watches in vain that keeps it. You taught me this that I might know myself; you abandoned me and you tried me...so that I would know myself. You had hardly gone a short distance from me when I fell. Then I saw and knew that you were guiding me; if I fell, it was my own fault, and if I rose again, it was by your help. "O my God, I could despair on account of my great sins and my innumerable negligence's...but I dare not because I, who was at one time Your enemy, have been reconciled to You by the death of Your Son; and not only reconciled, but I have been saved by Him. That is why all my HOPE and the certitude of my confidence is in His Precious Blood which was shed for us and for our salvation. Living in Him, trusting in Him, I HOPE to come to You, not because of my justice, but through the justice which comes to me from Your Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ. "Thus, in the weariness of this struggle, I raise my eyes to You, Lord Jesus. Let the enemy do what he will to me. I shall not fear because You are a strong defender. I have good reason to HOPE in You, for I shall never be confounded. "Now, as long as I am in the body, I am far from You, since I journey by faith and not by vision. The time will come when I will see that which I now believe without seeing and I shall happy. Then I shall see the reality which I now HOPE for. I live content in my HOPE because You are true to Your promises; nevertheless, because I do not possess You as yet, I groan beneath the weight of desire. Grant that I may persevere in this desire until what You have promised comes to pass; then my groaning will be over and praise alone will resound"(St.Auguestine).
