THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 8:23—9:3

The prophet Isaiah describes the anguish of a conquered people, but he promises that they will triumph and will see a great light as on the “day of Midian.”

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17

Paul speaks to the Corinthians with both anger and indignation because they are quarreling among themselves as to whom they should show allegiance. Some wish to follow Paul; some, Peter; others Apollos; others, Christ.

Gospel: Matthew 4:12-23

Jesus begins his mission by going to Capernaum, fulfilling the prophecy of Isaiah. He selects Peter, Andrew, James and John as his disciples, inviting them to be “fishers of men.”

33 Days to Eucharistic Glory: In the Book of Joshua, God’s people entered the Promised Land after wandering in the desert for forty years. Joshua asked the priests to carry the Ark of the Covenant before the people and said: “Consecrate yourselves to the Lord, for tomorrow He will do wonders among you.” Are you ready for a 33 day spiritual pilgrimage?

THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

“From that time on, Jesus began to preach and say, ‘Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!’ As he was walking by the sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea, they were fishermen. He said to them, ‘Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.’... ‘For Christ did not send me to baptize but to preach the gospel.’”

Jesus initiated His public ministry calling all to repentance and recognize the presence of the kingdom. He sought others, the brothers, to walk and work with Him, and then another pair of fishermen brothers. He desired to build His kingdom. We know how they responded.

He continues to walk among us, and the need to preach repentance and the presence of the kingdom is just as real. What if those four did not respond? How do I respond? How do I respond today?

kingdom of heaven is at hand.”

Sharing in the Mission of Jesus

An apostle, working with God for the good of souls, must live in intimate spiritual union with him, so as to enter as far as possible into his views and plans for the salvation of the world. Only by penetrating to the depths of the mystery of God's love for mankind can the apostle cooperate in the actual diffusion of love and grace.... The apostle must thoroughly understand that God's action on souls is entirely the action of love: it is the action of the Father who goes in search of the prodigal son, of the shepherd who seeks the sheep that has gone astray; it is the action of a God who offers his friendship to men to make them happy, to be able to welcome them into his Home, to admit them to his intimacy, to make them blessed with his eternal beatitude. An apostle should try to put his own heart into contact with the heart of God, that it may be filled with God's love and share in his charity toward men. The apostle should, as it were, have the mind of God, the mind of Christ, that is, he should cultivate deep sentiments of love for the brethren, a pale reflection of the love of God for men. Not only at prayer, but in the very exercise of the apostolate, the apostle should strive to keep in contact with God and with the mystery of his love for men, in which he should humbly collaborate. He will seek this contact by an intense practice of faith, which will give him a deeper understanding of the mystery of the Redemption and enable him to recognize the fulfillment of this mystery in the various circumstances of his life and in every event of time. This spirit of faith will help him to make his humble activity a part of the great action of God. In this way, even while making use of human means or when occupied with material affairs, the apostle will live in a supernatural atmosphere. He will never lose sight of the goal of his activity, but will always be very keenly aware that he is collaborating with Christ for the salvation of souls.

Meditation of the day: January 27

The Reward for Those Who Do the Will of God



Please go often, as you have time and opportunity, especially on feast days, and visit your dear daughters and sisters, and greet them; see how they are, comfort them; encourage them to stand firm in the life begun.... Although at times they will have troubles or anxieties, nevertheless this will soon pass away and be turned

into gladness and joy. And then, the suffering of this world is nothing in comparison with the blessings which are in Paradise. Also, let them hold this as most certain: that they will never be abandoned in their needs. God will provide for them wonderfully. They must not lose hope. How many lords, queens, and other great persons there are who, with the many riches and possessions they have, will not be able to find true relief in some extreme need; and yet these little ones, poor as they are, will find consolation and comfort.

Also, tell them that now I am more alive than when they saw me in the flesh, and that now I see them and know them better. And can and want to help them more, and that I am continually among them with my Lover—or rather ours, the Lover of us all—provided they believe and do not lose heart and hope. And so, especially for those you see disconsolate, doubtful, and faint-hearted, enlarge the scope of the promises, which will not go unfulfilled. Tell them that they should long to see me not on earth, but in heaven, where our love is. Let them set their hopes on high and not on earth. Let them have Jesus Christ for their only treasure, for there also will be love, which is to be sought not here in this world, but above, in the high heaven at the right hand of the Father, as the Apostle says: *If then you were raised with Christ, seek what is above.... Think of what is above, not of what is on earth* (Col 3:1-2).
