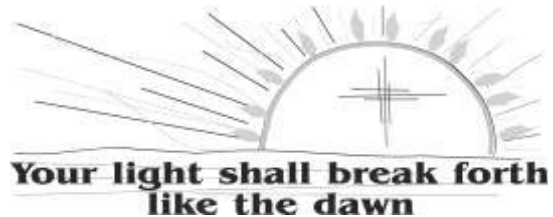

FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 58:7-10

This reading is a vigorous exhortation from the prophet Isaiah to lead lives of active charity and generosity. He promises that the Lord will be our “dawn,” our “rear guard,” our “light” if we share our bread, shelter the homeless, and clothe the naked.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 2:1-5

Paul tells the Corinthians that he and they must not rely on the so-called “wisdom” of secular teaching and philosophy but on the power of the Spirit.

Gospel: Matthew 5:13-16

Jesus reminds the disciples and all Christians that they carry special responsibilities to be “the salt of the earth.” They must not hide their light but show their goodness to all.

February 3rd was the Memorial of St. Blaise; Fr. Benny will be blessing throats this weekend after all the Masses.

"I came to you in weakness and fear and much trembling and my message and my proclamation were not with persuasive words of wisdom, but with a demonstration of Spirit and power... you are the salt of the earth... you are the light of the world."

“You are the light of the World...”

The Light That Glorifies God

We have to examine the intention of the human heart, where it is aimed at, what it has in mind. If anybody wants his good works to be seen by other people because he is parading his glory and his indispensability before their eyes, and seeking recognition of them from other people, then...his light has not so shone before men, that they should see his good works for the purpose of glorifying the Father in heaven. It's himself that he wanted glorified, not God; and it was his own profit he was looking for, not the will of the Lord he was choosing. Of such people the apostle says, *They are all looking after their own interests, not those of Jesus Christ* (Phil 2:21)....

Jesus said, *So let your light shine before men that they may see your good works*; but he immediately added why this was to be done: that they may glorify, he said, *your Father in heaven*. So when a person is seen by people to do good, his conscience should be prompted by the intention to do good, but not by any intention of getting well known for it, except for the praise of God and the advantage of those who get to know about it. The benefit they get from [another's good works] is being delighted with God who has enabled a person to do such things; and so not giving up hope if they want such a capacity for doing good to be granted to them as well!...

So if anybody wishes his works to be seen by the public in such a way that that God is glorified, from whom he has received the things that are seen in him, and so that the very people who see them are challenged...to imitate his good works—then his light really does shine before the world, because it is the brightness of -charity that he radiates.

OUR LADY of LOURDES

February 11, Wednesday



On this date in 1858 a beautiful woman first appeared to fourteen-year-old Bernadette Soubirous, a poor French girl. Clothed in a dazzling white dress girded in blue, the woman appeared in a dirty, dank hole, a stone grotto known to locals as the “pigs’ shelter.” On March 25, she revealed her name:

“**I am the Immaculate Conception.**” Only four years earlier, Pius IX had declared the dogma that Mary had been immaculately conceived in the womb of her mother, receiving the saving graces of her Son in anticipation of her divine motherhood. Today, the grotto at Lourdes receives six million visitors each year.
