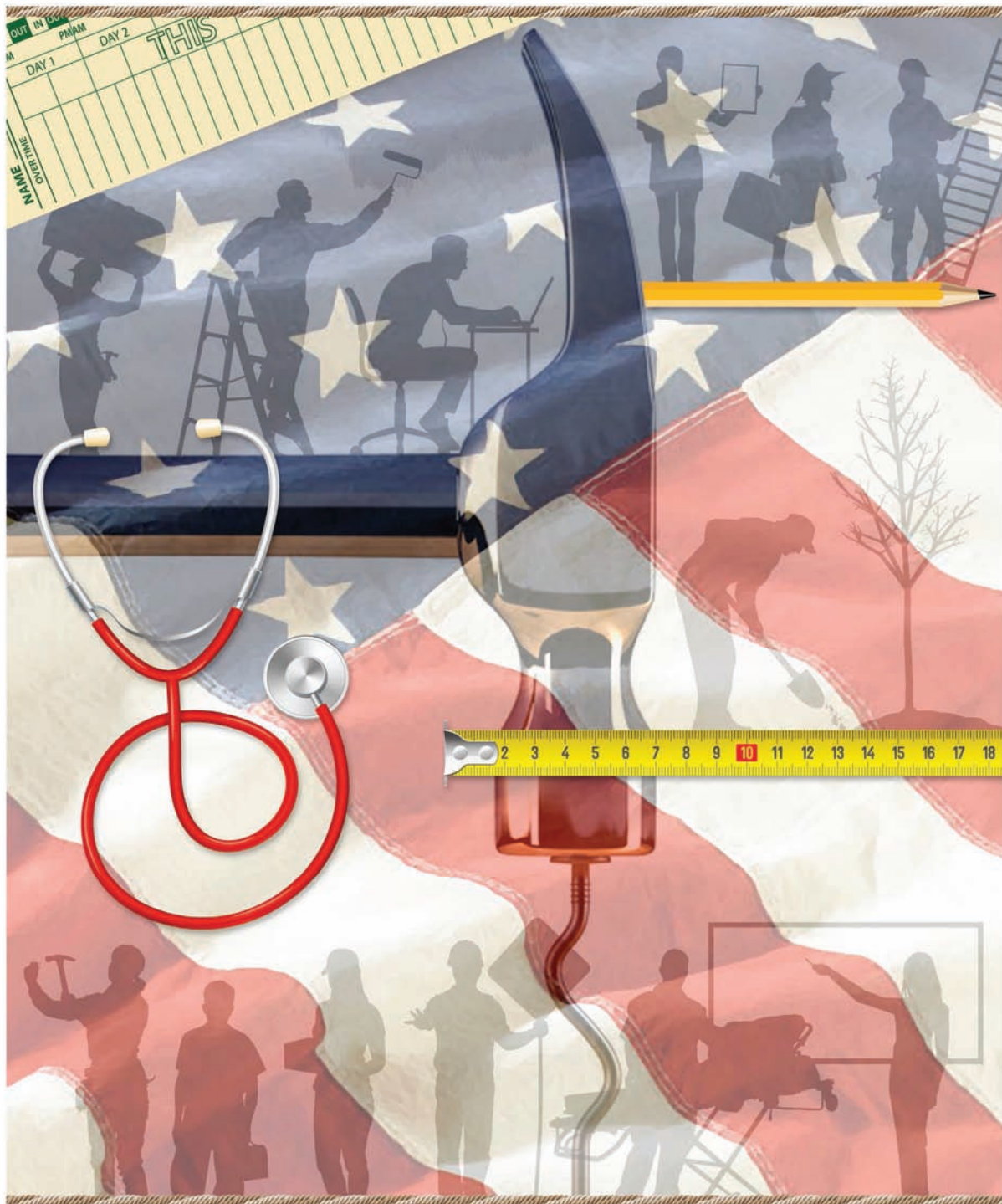

First Reading: Ezekiel 33:7-9

God has appointed the prophet as a watchman over his people. If he fails to give them warning against sin, he will be held responsible.

Second Reading: Romans 13:8-10

In this beautiful letter, Paul says that all commandments are contained in this: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

Gospel: Matthew 18:15-20

Jesus explains to his disciples how to respond to those who wrong them – with gentleness and practical wisdom. He promises that whenever "two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in their midst."

“You, son of man, I have appointed watchman for the house of Israel... But if you warn the wicked man, trying to turn him from his way, and he refuses to turn from his way, he shall die for his guilt... If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have won him over... if two of you agree about anything for which they are to pray, it shall be granted to them by my heavenly Father. For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them.”

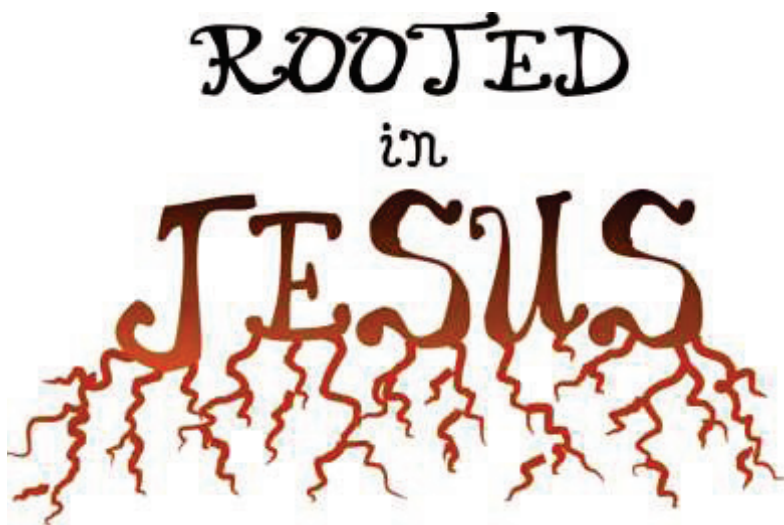

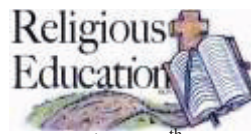
